Day 1	Hong Kong/Paro ~ Thimphu (55km/1.5 hours) 香港 ~ 帕羅 ~ 廷布 (L,D)
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The flight to Paro is one of the most spectacular in entire Himalayas. Flying along the Himalayan range, the journey offers fascinating views and an exciting descent into the Kingdom. Bhutan's first gift to you as you disembark from the aircraft will be cool, clean fresh mountain air. After immigration formalities and baggage collection, you will be met by our representative, and afterwards drive to **Thimphu 廷布**, the capital town of Bhutan with enroute stop at Chuzom, the confluence of Thimphu and Paro rivers. Three different styles of stupas: Tibetan, Nepalese and Bhutanese adorn this confluence.

Shortly before reaching Chuzom, you will see on your left **Tamchog Lhakhang**, the temple built by Thangtong Gyalpo, a pioneering engineer who introduced the construction of suspension bridges into Bhutan and Tibet (several of which are still in use today). The present bridge to Tamchog Lhakhang was restored in 2005 in the design of a traditional style with iron chains and crossing this iron bridge is a wonderful experience.

On arrival in Thimphu, check in at hotel.

The capital town of Bhutan and the centre of government, religion and commerce, Thimphu is a unique city with unusual mixture of modern development alongside ancient traditions. Although not what one expects from a capital city, Thimphu is still a fitting and lively place. Home to civil servants, expatriates and monk body, Thimphu maintains a strong national character in its architectural style.

Later in the afternoon visit **National Memorial Chorten 不丹國家紀念塔**, a large white structure crowned with a golden spire. It is located close to the center of Thimphu City and is one of its most iconic monuments. This is the most ideal spot to interact with locals who throng in large numbers to circumambulate the chorten, whirl the large red prayer wheels and pray at a small shrine inside the gate. The paintings and statues inside the monument provide a deep insight into Buddhist philosophy.

Afterwards an exploratory walk around Thimphu main street and market area.

Explore **Ka Ja Throm**. Previously known as the Centenary Farmers Market (CFM), Kaja Throm marks a significant transformation in Thimphu's urban landscape and is designated as the Market Quarter where leisure, culture, knowledge, employment, and tourism economic converge. The upgraded Kaja Throm is a vibrant and bustling market Center where the modern and traditional elements of Bhutanese life converge. Whether you're seeking local handicrafts, farm products, savor local cuisine or simply a place to soak in the atmosphere, Ka Ja Throm provides a quintessential Thimphu experience.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Thimphu (Altitude 2,320m)

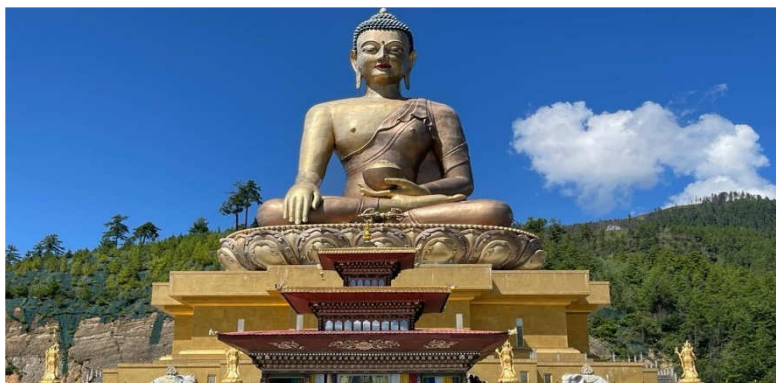

Day 2

Thimphu 廷布

(B,L,D)

Morning after breakfast, take a short drive to the north of town to **Buddha Dordenma 釋迦牟尼大佛**, located atop a hill in Kuenselphodrang Nature Park. The statue fulfils an ancient prophecy dating back to the 8th century A.D. that was discovered by Terton Pema Lingpa (Religious Treasure Discoverer) and is said



to emanate an aura of peace and happiness to the entire world. This massive statue of Shakyamuni made of bronze and is gilded in gold, measures 51.5 meters in height, making it one of the largest statues in Bhutan.

125,000 smaller Buddha statues have been placed within the Buddha Dordenma statue, each of these also have been cast in bronze and gilded. Visitors can get a good overview of the Thimphu valley from here.

Then embark on Buddha Dordenma to Changangkha Lhakhang (approx. 1.5 hours easy walk) hike. As you move on this trail, you'll be greeted by a magnificent sight of thousands of prayer flags waving in the breeze, creating a colourful and spiritual welcome. The trail leads you through a pristine forest adorned with tall pines, graceful birch trees, and vibrant rhododendrons. Entire trail is well-maintained and along the way, you'll come across charming gazebos, providing perfect vantage points. Visit **Changangkha Lhakhang**, one of the ancient temples located on a ridge above Thimphu. It was established on a site chosen by Lama Phajo Drugom Shigpo, who came from Tibet and regarded as the founder of Drukpa lineage in Bhutan. The temple was laid in 12th century while the work of which was extended by his son in the 13th century. The central statue here is Chenrezig in a manifestation with 11 heads. For centuries, parents come here for blessing of their new borns from the protector deity Tamdrin and children are blessed by a phurba (ritual dagger) and given a sacred thread. From temple courtyard, there is fascinating view of Thimphu valley.

Visit **Drubthob Goema / Zilukha Nunnery**: Perched on a promontory, overlooking picturesque Trashichhoedzong and Golf Course, it is the only nunnery in capital known as Zilukha Anim Dratsang, once belonged to the Drubthob (Realized one) Thang Thong Gyalpo often referred to as the King of the open field (in the early 15th century with his multiple talents he popularly became the Leonardo da Vinci of the Great Himalayas). You may interact here with some of the nuns who have devoted their life to spirituality and Buddhism.

After lunch, for an insight into traditional crafts of Bhutan, visit **National Institute for Zorig Chusum**, established in 1971. It is the premier institute to preserve and promote thirteen traditional art and crafts of Bhutan. Commonly known as Arts & Crafts School or Painting School, the Institute offers 4-to-6 years courses in 13 traditional arts and crafts of Bhutan.

This is followed by visit to the **Folk Heritage Museum**, dedicated to connecting people to the Bhutanese rural past through exhibits, demonstrations, educational programmes and documentation of rural life.

Concluded the sightseeing for the day with visit to **Trashichhoedzong, "fortress of the glorious religion"**. This is the center of government and religion, site of monarch's throne room and seat of Je Khenpo or Chief Abbot. Built in 1641 by the political and religious unifier of Bhutan, Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyal, it was reconstructed in 1960s in traditional Bhutanese manner, without nails or architectural plans.

Dinner and Overnight at hotel in Thimphu (Altitude: 2,320m)

Meal: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Day 3

Thimphu – Punakha (75km/2.5 hours) 廷布 - 普納卡

(B,L,D)



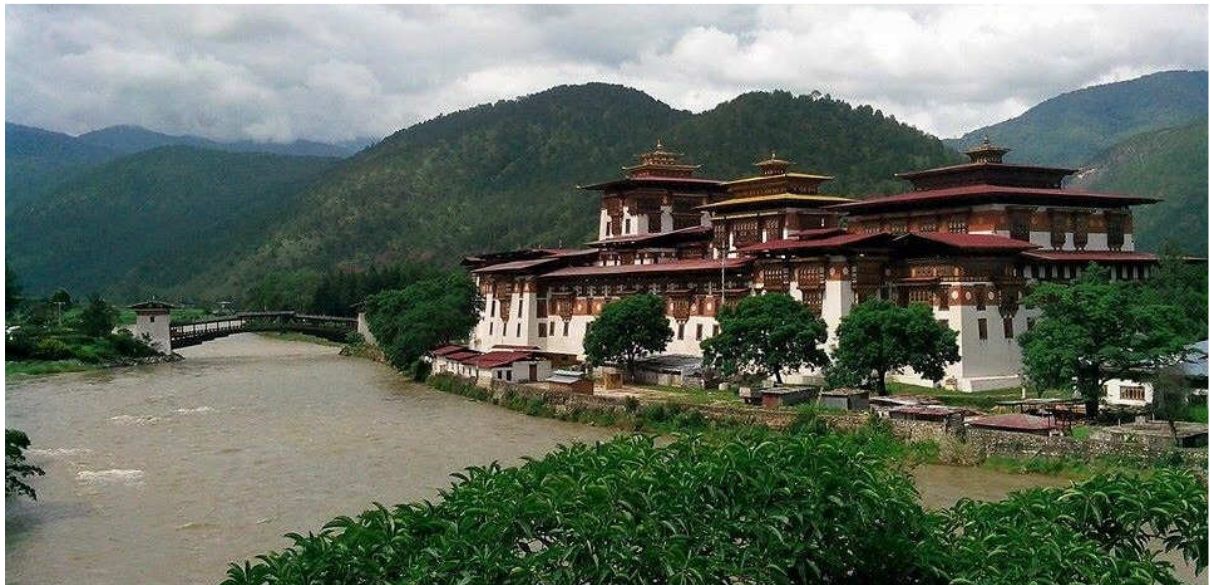
After breakfast, drive to Punakha across **Dochula Pass 多楚拉隘口** (3,088m/10,130 ft) stopping briefly here to take in the view and admire the chorten, mani wall, and prayer flags which decorate the highest point on the road. If skies are clear, the following peaks can be seen from this pass (left to right):

Masagang (7,158m), Tsendagang (6,960m), Terigang (7,060m), Jejegangphugang (7,158m), Kangphugang (7,170m), Zongphugang (7,060m), a Table Mountain that dominates the isolated region of Lunana – finally Gangkar puensum, the

highest peak in Bhutan at 7,497m.

At **Dochula Pass 多楚拉隘口**, 108 chortens or stupas known as Druk Wangyal Chortens have been built by Ashi Dorji Wangmo Wangchuk, the eldest Queen Mother. These chortens are built in three layers, the first lowest level payer has forty-five chortens, the second has thirty-six and the top layer has twenty-seven, built around the main chorten.

Punakha served as the capital of Bhutan and seat of government until 1955 and still it is the winter seat of Je Khenpo (the chief abbot). Blessed with temperate climate and owing to its natural drainage from Pho Chhu (male) and Mo Chhu (female) rivers, the fertile Punakha valley produces abundant crops and fruits. Located at an elevation of 1300m above sea level, Punakha enjoys mild winters and is popular year-round destination.



After lunch, visit **Punakha Dzong 普那卡宗** or “Palace of Great Happiness”, built at the junction of the Phochu and Mochu rivers in 1637 by Zhabdrung Ngawang Namgyal. This majestic dzong served as both the religious and the administrative centre of Bhutan in the past. It measures some 600 by 240 feet and has a six-storeys, gold-domed tower. Inside are courtyards and religious statuary that hint at the depth of history and spiritual tradition embodied here. Your guide will illuminate your understanding of this intricate culture that is exotic to us, though long established here.

Enroute take a short excursion to **Chimi Lhakhang 奇美廟/求子廟**.

The Chimi Lhakhang, situated on a hillock in the centre of the valley, also known as the temple of fertility. It is widely believed that couples who do not have children and wanting one, if they pray at the temple, they are usually blessed with a child very soon. The trail leads across rice fields to the tiny settlement of Pana, meaning “field”. A walk through the village near the temple will give you a rare glimpse into the daily life and lifestyle of the villagers.

Upon arrival at Punakha, check-in at hotel.

Evening at leisure.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Punakha (Altitude 1,300m)

Meal: Breakfast, Lunch and dinner

Day 4 Punakha – Paro (125km/4.5hours) 普那卡 ~ 帕羅 (B,L,D)

After breakfast, drive to Paro along the scenic highway.

On arrival in Paro, check-in at hotel.

The beautiful valley of Paro encapsulates within itself a rich culture, scenic beauty and hundreds of myths and legends. It is home to many of the Bhutan’s oldest temples and monasteries, National Museum and country’s only international airport. Mount Chomolhari (7,314m) reigns in white glory

at the northern end of the valley and its glacial water plunge through deep gorges to form Pa Chhu (Paro River). Paro is also one of the most fertile valleys in the Kingdom producing a bulk of the locally famous red rice from its terraced fields.

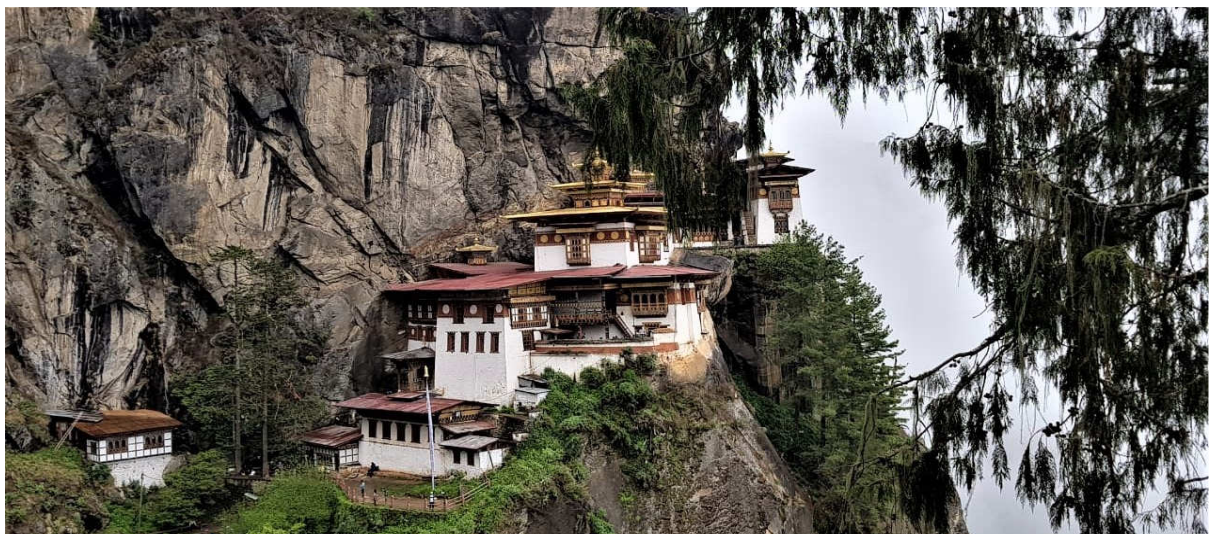
After lunch, visit **Ta Dzong 塔宗/不丹國家博物館** which was originally built as a Watchtower, which now houses National Museum. The extensive collection includes antique thangka paintings, textiles, weapons & armour, household objects and a rich assortment of natural and historic artifacts. Visit **Rinpung Dzong 日蓬宗 (Paro Dzong 帕羅宗)**, meaning “Fortress of the heap of jewels”, which has a long and fascinating history. Walk in to visit a **traditional farmhouse**. These charming structures, often adorned with intricate woodwork and painted in vibrant colors, are a testament to Bhutan’s architectural heritage. Visitors have the opportunity to experience the warmth of Bhutanese hospitality, savor authentic local cuisine, witness traditional farming practices, and immerse themselves in the tranquil ambiance of the countryside. It’s a unique and enriching way to connect with traditions and way of life that have endured for generations in this picturesque region Here you’ll also have opportunity to try your hand in Archery using traditional bamboo bow & arrow. Archery is Bhutan’s national sport and integral part of all special occasions.

Dinner and Overnight at hotel in Paro (Altitude 2,280m)

Meal: Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner

Day 5	Paro	帕羅	(B,L,D)
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After breakfast, depart for an excursion to **Taktshang Monaster or Tiger’s Nest 虎穴寺** (approx. 5 hours round trip walk).



It is one of the most famous Bhutan’s monasteries, perched on the side of a cliff 900m above the Paro valley floor. It is said that Guru Rinpoche arrived here on the back of a tigress and meditated at this monastery and hence it is called “Tiger’s Nest”. This site has been recognised as a most sacred place

and visited by Shabdrung Ngawang Nangyal in 1646 and now visited by all Bhutanese at least once in their lifetime.

Visit the 7th century **Kyichu Lhakhang** 祈楚寺/千手觀音寺, one of the 108 temples built in the Himalayas by Tibetn King, Songtsen Gampo. The building of this temple marks the introduction of Buddhism in Bhutan.

Evening explore the Paro local market and city centre.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Paro. (Altitude 2,280m)

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch and dinner

Day 6	Paro/Hong Kong via Calcutta	帕羅 (加爾各答) ~ 香港	(B,L)
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Enjoy breakfast at hotel. Rest of the day free at leisure.

Lunch at a local restaurant.

Transfer to airport for your flight back to Hong Kong.
